





Our 36-year History – a Story to Celebrate!

In 1986 Lawrence Bryan and friends founded SJCMS so that South Bay audiences could enjoy a quality professional chamber music concert series here in San Jose. All concerts were presented in First Unitarian Church downtown until 1993, when our audience outgrew the rotunda's capacity. From 1994, all of our concerts were held in the delightful 318-seat Trianon Theatre—until May 2019 when Trianon was sold and ceased being a concert hall. For 2019-20 we relocated our series close by to the Concert Hall at the San Jose State University School of Music and Dance, until Covid closed the campus. We now invite you to continue enjoying our concerts in our resonant new home in Willow Glen-St. Francis Episcopal Church, at 1205 Pine Ave., at Newport Ave., San Jose.

OUR VENUE

LOCATION, TIME, PARKING & CONCERT PROTOCOL

We welcome you to our accessible venue for the 23-24 season, St. Francis Episcopal Church, in the Willow Glen area of San Jose, at 1205 Pine Avenue, corner Newport Avenue—with VTA bus stop. Pine



Avenue intersects Lincoln Avenue, which connects with CA-87 via Curtner Avenue. Pine Avenue, as Hamilton Ave., intersects Hwy. 17.

This sanctuary has lively acoustics, 244 comfortable, wide seats, and a superior 9'2" Bechstein concert grand piano.

All concerts start at 7:00pm.

The church has 20 on-site parking spaces (4 handicapped-only parking) accessed via a one-way alley entered from Pine Avenue, and exiting onto Newport Avenue.

Ample parking is available on neighborhood streets.

No food or beverages are allowed inside the church.

We will follow all required health and safety protocols-CDC, State, County, City, Diocesan, and St. Francis Episcopal Church.

Tesla Quartet (New York City) plays music of Dvořák, Jesse Montgomery, Leoš Janáček, & Beethoven!



Program: DVOŘÁK *Echo of Songs* (Cypresses), (selections), B.152 (1887); Jesse MONTGOMERY *Strum* (2015); Leoš JANÁČEK String Quartet #1 "*Kreutzer Sonata*" (1923); BEETHOVEN *Razumovsky* String Quartet in C Major, Op.59 #3, "*Hero*" (1806).

Music: Enjoy **Dvořák's** youthful love songs [1865] re-arranged for string quartet. • In Jesse **Montgomery's** *Strum* the variety of plucking techniques makes the quartet feel more like a "band." • Inspired by Tolstoy's novella, **Janáček** eloquently portrays sensations, emotions and actions, in evocative modern but tonal music. • **Beethoven's** *Razumovsky* Quartets are grand in scale, and the fugal finale of #3 is triumphant.

Artists: Praised for their "superb capacity to find the inner heart of everything they play" (The International Review of Music), the Tesla Quartet brings refinement and prowess to both new and established repertoire. Dubbed "technically superb" by The Strad, the Tesla Quartet, formed at The Juilliard School in 2008, has won top prizes in numerous international competitions, including three in 2018 at Banff, and as John Lad Prize-winners at Stanford's Bing Concert Hall.

Leoš Janáček & Hans Krása Quartets, & Dvořák Piano Quintet!





Program: Hans KRÁSA (1899-1944) Theme and Variations for string quartet (1936); Leoš JANÁČEK String Quartet #2, "Intimate Letters" (1928); Antonín DVOŘÁK Piano Quintet #2 in A Major, Op.81 (1887); – and a SMETANA surprise!

Music: Prague-born Hans **Krása** composed his Theme with Variations while a musical leader confined in Terezin concentration camp. • **Janáček's** 2nd Quartet, "Intimate Letters"—his "manifesto on love"—portrays his long and spiritual friendship with Kamila Stosslova and the 700+ letters they exchanged. • **Dvořák's** masterful 2nd Piano Quintet charms with his expressive lyricism and his Czech folk *Dumka* and *Furiant* movements.

Artists: The Prague-based Bennewitz Quartet—Osaka and Borciani Competitions-winners—has won critical acclaim and prompt re-bookings by its U.S. and European presenters. "Drama, expression, and utmost sensitivity" says The Strad. • Fanfare Magazine writes that Arsentiy Kharitonov, winner of the Liszt and Rachmaninov Competitions, has "sumptuous tone, technical mastery, broad dramatic range, and elegant phrasing [which] place him in the top ranks of keyboard players today."

Beo String Quartet (Pittsburgh) brings us Bach, Haydn, Shostakovich, & our first hearings of Gabriela Ortiz, Missy Mazzoli, & Sean Neukom!



Program: J.S. BACH *The Art of Fugue* (selections), BWV 1080 (c.1742); HAYDN String Quartet in G Major, Op.33 #5 (1781); Dmitri SHOSTAKOVICH String Quartet #8 in C Major, Op.110 (1960); Gabriela ORTIZ *Mictlán (Place of the Dead)* from "Altar de Muertos" (1997); Missy MAZZOLI *Enthusiasm Strategies* (2019); Beo violist Sean NEUKOM *El Balcón* (2022).

Music: Bach's profound *The Art of Fugue* lends itself to string as well as keyboard renditions. • Haydn's Op.33 Quartets astonished Mozart. • Shostakovich dedicated his riveting, powerful Quartet #8 "in memory of the victims of fascism and war." • Mexican Grammy-nominee Ortiz' *Mictlán* pulsingly portrays this underworld region of Aztec mythology. • Grammy-nominee Mazzoli's music conveys enthusiasm and joy. • Mexican-American Sean Neukom's *El Balcón* is the story of a childhood dream from the composer's mother in Mexico.

Artists: Praised for their "supernatural one-ness of interpretive intent" (New York Concert Review), the **Beo String Quartet** is a daring, genre-defying ensemble. They have 65 world premieres to their credit, and have performed 140 concert works throughout the U.S., America and Europe. Beo will release their CD of Bach's *The Art of Fugue* in 2023.

Program: HAYDN Piano Trio #10 in A Major, Hob XV:35 (c.1771); Nicky SOHN *Chesterton's Gardens* for piano trio (2023) **world premiere!**; TURINA *Circulo:* Fantasy for Piano, Violin, & Cello, Op.91 (1936); BRAHMS Piano Trio #2 in C Major, Op.87 (1880-82).

Music: Haydn's 45 piano trios are delightful and feature brilliant piano writing. • Nicky Sohn splendidly captures the vivid world of G. K. Chesterton's "The Secret Garden," a world premier commissioned by The Lee Trio! • Turina's cyclic fantasy *Circulo* portrays the round of a day in Spain—from morning through midday to the unwinding at evening. • Brahms' romantic voice surges, creating a masterful new model for the piano trio.

Artists: Since its critically acclaimed Wigmore Hall debut in 2002, The Lee Trio's "gripping immediacy and freshness" and "rich palette of colours" (The Strad) continue to move audiences and critics around the globe. This prize-winning ensemble of sisters has performed to acclaim in China, the U.S., and Europe, and is passionate about working with living composers, including Korean-American Nicky Sohn. "The [Lee] Trio really inhabited every phrase, speaking with conviction and flair." (The Strad).
